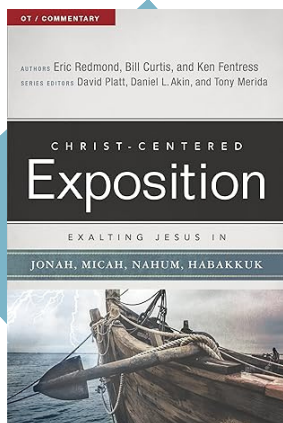

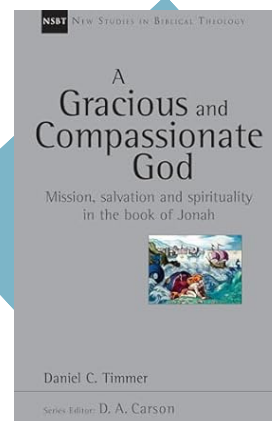
Exalting Jesus in Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk
